Executive Summary

With the Integrated Action Plan presented in this document the City of Manresa has developed its sustainability strategy towards 2030. The goal of this Action Plan is to translate the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) locally into policy planning, supporting the design, implementation, monitoring and review of locally-appropriate SDG actions. At the same time, the City Council aims at making this holistic and integrated strategy of sustainability coherent and aligned with the UN New Urban Agenda as well as the European and the Spanish Urban Agendas, therefore leading in the setting up of the **Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030**.

The Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030, materialised through the Integrated Action Plan of the City of Manresa outlined in this document, is the result of several years of work, in which a comprehensive participatory process has been conducted jointly with different local stakeholders and the citizens. During this process, Manresa City Council has engaged with multiple actors in a co-creation and participatory processes devoted to localise the global goals of sustainability and to identify key local targets and actions in order to achieve policy coherence across sectors, partners and geographic and administrative borders.

Manresa joined the **URBACT network Global Goals for Cities** in March 2021, together with other 18 European cities, to create the city strategy of sustainability towards 2030, to learn and exchange knowledge and practical experiences in a peer-based methodology, using URBACT tools and following its principles, with the ultimate aim of developing an action plan for its local 2030 Agenda. A city diagnosis based on challenges and opportunities, a future vision and targets of sustainability, and a detailed list of cross-cutting actions to achieve them, supported by a governance model and an assessment system, are the main components of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030.

The Agenda is composed of one shared vision of the future, 8 missions, 175 local sustainability targets and 30 transformative integrated actions to be implemented by 2030.

The common **vision** for the Manresa 2030 focuses on achieving a city that ensures social inclusion and equality, while promoting a sustainable economic modernisation with a territorial perspective. It will be a city of 15 minutes that preserves the urban and peri-urban nature, as well as its local heritage and its strong local identity.

The vision of the Manresa of the 2030 is materialised into **8 missions and 30 transformative integrated actions** that include the promotion of a more sustainable mobility, the preservation of Manresa's historical, cultural and architectural heritage, the development and improvement of green areas and the Green Ring, the reduction of inequalities and improvement of social inclusion, the promotion of a competitive and sustainable local economy, the incorporation of transparency, citizen participation, gender perspective and evaluation of results in all municipal policies, and the establishment of a solid multi-stakeholder and multi-level alliances to achieve the SDGs and the Spanish Urban Agenda, giving special support to organisations and citizen initiatives.





Political statement / statement of support

Manresa is one of the first Catalan municipalities that started working on the localization of the Sustainable Development Goals in 2018, thanks to the support of the Provincial Council and the Eurotowns network of medium-sized cities.

Thus, we were already committed when the URBACT Secretariat chose Manresa to take part of URBACT Global Goals for Cities, a network of 19 European cities aimed at the localization of global sustainability agendas, through the elaboration and sharing of the so-called local Integrated Actions Plans.

For our municipality, it is crucial to align our city strategy with the global objectives of sustainability, set out mainly by the UN both in the 2030 Agenda and the New Urban Agenda, because we are aware that our cities are a main part of the problem of the climate and social emergency: we produce a large part of CO2 emissions, waste, inequalities and urban poverty. But cities must also be, and can be, part of the solution, creating low-emission zones, promoting public transport and better walking routes, facilitating circular economy in our industrial and commercial areas, enhancing local services, creating more natural and urban climate shelters, boosting cohesion and social inclusion programs, and guaranteeing affordable housing, gender equality, support for vulnerable people and reception of refugees.

But in order to take action, we must really believe that we have a problem and that we can provide solutions at the local level, even if the path is not easy and that some solutions may even seem to be inconsistent with each other. In the end, we must always choose the solutions with the least negative and most positive environmental and social impact.

We need to do all this with a transversal and comprehensive vision of all policies: social, educational, economic, environmental, cultural, health, housing, and so on, with the complicity and involvement of all administrations, with shared resources, and last but not least, with the active involvement of our local stakeholders and citizens, so as to leave no one behind, as stated in the 2030 Agenda.

Knowledge from URBACT experts and exchanging experiences among peer cities must be used to share challenges and to find and test methods and tools on the field that helps us to reach proper solutions, such as strategic planning tools, participation methodologies, use of progress indicators, how to budget alignment with local objectives, among others.

Ultimately, our main mission is to make our cities greener, fairer and more productive, according to the new Leipzig Charter on the transformative power of cities for the common good, approved in 2020 by the European ministers of urban development.

Part 1 – Setting the scene

What the Action Plan is about and why it's been developed

This Action Plan has been developed following participation in the Global Goals for Cities Pilot Network, in partnership with URBACT. Over a period of 22 months, between March 2021 and December, 2022 URBACT funded and guided the Global Goals for Cities Pilot Network with a core fixed group of 19 European cities, aimed to design an Integrated Action Plan on the localisation of the Sustainable Development Goals.

Using the URBACT Method, Manresa City Council has developed this Action Plan to integrate the city strategy of sustainability towards 2030, in order to translate the SDGs locally into policy planning, supporting the design, implementation, monitoring and review of locally-appropriate SDG actions.

At the same time, the City Council aims at making this holistic and integrated strategy of sustainability coherent and aligned with the UN New Urban Agenda as well as the European and the Spanish Urban Agendas, thus setting the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030.

Introduction to Localising Sustainable Development Goals¹

"Localising the SDGs" is a growing, multi-faceted practice, which started taking shape in 2015 when cities were officially placed at the heart of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development adopted by all 193 United Nations member states in 2015. The 2030 Agenda outlines a shared vision for transforming our world by 2030, while the Sustainable Development Goals – the 17 SDGs - provide the blueprint for achieving the vision. Under each SDG, there are several targets, adding to a total of 169 in the overall framework. To monitor progress, 231 unique indicators have so far been proposed for the global level.

While officially adopted by national governments, the need to involve local stakeholders has been recognised since the adoption of the 2030 Agenda. The 2030 Agenda further departs from previous global development agendas in that it applies to all countries equally and is not only focussed on less developed countries.

When adopting the agenda, SDG 11: *Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable* was singled out as its own distinct goal in a multilateral agreement. It covers a wide range of issues relevant to local governments, like affordable housing, public transport, planning and governance, cultural heritage, disaster risk management, air quality, waste management and access to public and green spaces.

Localising the SDGs goes beyond SDG 11. Several international organisations have pointed out that many SDGs and targets – around 65% – will not be reached without the active involvement and contribution by local and regional governments (OECD, 2020). The SDGs hence apply to cities and municipalities as governments in their own right – and not only as "mere implementers" of global agenda set elsewhere (UCLG, 2017).

SDG localisation refers to the process of taking into account local and regional context to achieve the 2030 Agenda, through multiple-stakeholders engagement and participation and the joint definition and co-creation of actions, means of implementation and monitoring-accountability strategies.

In other words, localising the SDGs is about taking the 17 global Sustainable Development Goals and their 169 targets and translating them into local contexts, designing actions that contribute to desired outcomes and monitoring progress through relevant indicators suited for the local level.

SDG localisation is typically summarised in four key steps, first proposed by Kanuri, Revi, Espey & Kuhle (2016) in a joint UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) and the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH publication. These are:

- 1. Raising awareness about the SDGs and starting a participatory process.
- 2. Setting a shared SDGs agenda with local stakeholders.
- 3. Conducting goal-based planning to identify actions that can contribute to achieving the SDGs.
- 4. Monitoring and evaluating progress, through local monitoring systems that are relevant to the global framework of goals and targets, yet locally tailored.

Those same authors have further pointed out that localising the SDGs imply certain effective governance practices, such as (Kanuri, Revi, Espey & Kuhle, 2016, pp. 66-67):

- Be informed and accountable. Use evidence-based information as leverage to advocate for greater powers. Evaluate performance on expenditure management, key governance and sector-based indicators.
- Improve transparency and inclusion in local government through more open governance, open data, and greater public participation.
- Work in partnership with higher levels of government and with local communities. Gain trust and open dialogue.
- Cooperate with neighbouring local governments through formal or informal mechanisms, e.g. around issues beyond the municipal borders like mobility, protected areas or waste management.
- Join networks of cities and local governments to exchange best practices. Convene public support for stronger local government.

Manresa City Council has engaged multiple local stakeholders in a co-creation and participatory processes devoted to localise the global goals of sustainability and to identify key local targets and actions in order to achieve policy coherence across sectors, partners and geographic and administrative borders.

To continue building on these efforts, Manresa joined the URBACT network Global Goals for Cities in March 2021, together with other 18 European cities, to learn and exchange knowledge and practical experiences in a peer-based methodology, using URBACT tools and following its principles, with the ultimate aim at developing an action plan for its local 2030 Agenda.





Global Goals 4 Cities Network (GG4C)²

Global Goals for Cities is a pilot network proposed and funded by URBACT in partnership with the Council of European Municipalities and Regions (CEMR) to support cities in the process of localising the UN 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in their respective local contexts.

The SDGs are 17 interlinked global goals designed to be a blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. The main aim of the network is to support cities to plan for integrated and participative urban development – _exchanging experiences, learning methodologies and tools – _and thus enhance the process of SDG localisation. With 19 partner cities from 19 member states, the pilot network responds to a growing interest and need among European cities in implementing the 2030 Agenda and is larger than any other URBACT network in terms of number of partners. Its duration is from 9 March 2021 to 31 December 2022. In this period, the city of Manresa, along with the partner cities have developed its own Integrated Action Plan (IAP), focussing on prioritised areas of the SDGs framework and localisation process relevant to the local context.

Alignment of the IAP with the Spanish Urban Agenda³

The Spanish Urban Agenda (AUE) is a strategic document, without normative character, and therefore of voluntary adherence, which, in accordance with the criteria established by the 2030 Agenda, the new United Nations Urban Agenda and the Urban Agenda for European Union pursues the achievement of sustainability in urban development policies. It also constitutes a working method and a process for all stakeholders, public and private, who intervene in cities and who seek equitable, fair and sustainable development from their different fields of action.

This integrated urban development strategy offers a Decalogue of Strategic Objectives that display, in turn, a total of 30 specific objectives, and 291 lines of action, making available to those who are interested in its implementation, a true "à la carte menu" so that they can prepare their own Action Plans. All this is done from a broad vision that includes all towns and cities regardless of their size and population, and under the triple prism of economic, social and environmental sustainability.

Manresa City Council, in parallel with the work done on SDGs and with the URBACT network, subscribed its adherence to the Spanish Urban Agenda on September, 12, 2022, and committed to set out its local integrated action plan, in coherence with both the 17 SDGs and the 10 Strategic Objectives of the Spanish Urban Agenda. This IAP will serve as a pilot project and a transferable good practice in order to guide other municipalities in their own action plans.

Indeed, both Agendas of sustainability (the 2030 Agenda and the Spanish Urban Agenda) share the same methodology, based on a wide and inclusive participatory process at all levels and in all the intervention logic, and the integrated vision and management of the three spheres of sustainability. A previous city diagnosis based on challenges and opportunities, a future vision and targets of sustainability, and a detailed list of actions to achieve them, supported by a governance model and an assessment system, are the main components of both Agendas.

Thus, it made all the sense that the process the municipality of Manresa has been carrying out in the last four years, related to the city sustainability strategy, would lead to integrate both approaches in a single IAP: the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030.

1.1. Local Context and Policy Challenges

1.1.1. Local context

Manresa is located in the province of Barcelona in the Autonomous Community of Catalonia, in the North-East of Spain, at 60 km from the sea, between the Mediterranean and the temperate continental area. At the crossroads of two rivers and three strategic communication axes in Catalonia, Manresa has a remarkable industrial and commercial tradition. It is the core city of a metro area of 130.000 inhabitants, the capital of Bages County, and the main city of Central Catalonia (over 300.000 people). Manresa has a millenary history, which has left an important medieval and Baroque heritage, combined with modernist and industrial legacy of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. It is a hilly and dense city, with a vibrant cultural life and a wide range of sport facilities, surrounded by an attractive green belt which combines forest and farmland, including vineyards. It is a privileged area for agriculture, leisure, tourism, biodiversity and environmental awareness.

The municipality of Manresa has the competences established in the Statute of Autonomy of Catalonia and it employs more than 700 people. One of the main objectives of Manresa city hall is to boost cooperation between Administration, universities, research centres, business sector, NGOs and citizens, in order to promote a greener and innovation-based economy, to achieve a more socially cohesive community, to better protect urban and peri-urban biodiversity and to combat the climate emergency.

To do so, Strategic Planning has been centralised in the municipal Service of Mayor's Staff and Presidency. The Municipal Action Plan (PAM), done every four-years mandate, as well as Financial Planning and Annual Budget are currently undertaken by the Service of Mayor's Staff and Presidency, while all municipal departments can design and implement their own sectoral plans.

Relevant stakeholders and citizens are invited to participate when designing new sectoral plans, as well as the municipal action plan. A wide participatory process was also carried out to elaborate the last strategic city plan for 2005-2015.

There are also regular participative councils: one Citizens' Council, ten Sectoral Councils for specific topics, as well as four Territorial Councils, one for each district of the city. In mid 2020, due to the pandemic, the municipality created a Board for the Social and Economic Reconstruction Plan of Manresa, composed by municipal staff, political groups and local representatives of civil society, which was integrated in October, 2021 into the URBACT Local Group (ULG), with the mission to work in the localisation of the SDGs through an Integrated Action Plan, called the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030.

Although the last holistic and strategic plan that Manresa had in place was for the period 2005-2015, and the municipality still doesn't have a new strategy for the whole city in the mid and long term, the city of Manresa has launched in the last years several policy strategic plans and actions oriented to promote a more sustainable, equitable and socially just city.

Strategic documents that guide current actions by the municipality include:

- The annual municipal budget
- The Municipal Action Plan 2020-2023
- Up to 14 current sectoral plans (e.g. Education, Health, Gender, Youth, Industry, Culture, Security)
- Post-COVID Social and Economic Reconstruction Plan





Both the Municipal Action Plan 2020-2023 and the Post-COVID Economic Recovery Plan were already aligned with the SDGs.

Besides, since 2018, the municipality of Manresa has boosted a structured and more specific process for localising the SDGs in the city, in order to set and implement the Integrated Action Plan, so is the **Urban Agenda** of Manresa 2030.

The Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030 is a holistic strategy *for the whole city*, not only for the city council, and has been designed *beyond the political mandate*, as a long-term *participatory process*, agreed by all political groups of the municipality, in an a attempt to be more resilient to political change and new local governments to come.

1.1.2. Analysis of the initial situation and policy challenges

When it comes to the SDGs localisation process, Manresa has enjoyed technical and financial support from the Provincial Government of Barcelona, which has showcased its experience both in the province and internationally. The Spanish Association of Municipalities has also created a working group for the Agenda 2030, and another for the New Urban Agenda for the EU, although they are not very active. The regional government works as well in the Agenda 2030 at Catalonia, but they hardly network with municipalities, as is the case of the Spanish Ministry, which is developing the Strategy for Sustainable Development 2030.

Box 1: Political commitments by the current local government

Municipal elections are held every four years, on the last Sunday of May, and they cannot be advanced or delayed. The current period runs from 2020 to 2023.

Key political commitments include:

Social and economic recovery from the pandemic

Boosting the industry of the county and transform it into greener, more digital and more innovative sector

Strategic project called Manresa 2022, to become a touristic sustainable destination (based on the legacy of Saint Ignatius of Loyola stay in Manresa 500 years ago).

Integral recovery of the Historic Centre (urban, social, economic boosting)

New system of urban waste collection to increase recycling rates

Becoming a greener city with sustainable mobility and privileged natural surroundings for leisure, health and sports activities

Ensuring the inclusion of new citizens, with special attention to the promotion of affordable and sustainable housing

At international level, Manresa participates in the Global Goals Task Team of the medium-sized city network Eurotowns, and hosted the last meeting of the group before the pandemic's lockdown, as well as the network's General Assembly in November 2022. The city is also member of the Executive Committee of Eurotowns since 2019.

Consequently, the most important sources and exchange of information about localising SDGs come from sub-national authorities, international city networks and organisations, as well as mainstream media⁴.

Since 2018, Manresa City Council, aware of the importance of citizen engagement to achieve the SDGs at a local level, has carried out actions and campaigns aimed at informing, raising awareness and giving a voice to local agents, citizens and municipal staff to set up the city's 2030 Agenda. As a result of this participatory process, it was published in May 2021 the report *"The challenge of the Sustainable Development Goals in Manresa"*. This document included the current situation and the alignment of municipal policies with global objectives. The document also identified the local targets to achieve them and the actors involved in implementing and evaluating the city's sustainability strategy for the coming years.

The external participatory process was launched at the end of 2019, after the municipal technical team had already published a first draft, which described Manresa's situation with respect to each of the SDGs and set a first proposal of local targets, and a second report, worked crosswise with the various council offices and the municipal technical staff, which was presented as a basis document for starting the participatory process for prioritising SDGs and local targets, making new contributions and proposing actions.

The pandemic extended the planned deadlines but, finally, in the middle of 2021, the initial participatory process was finished, and the City Council published the final report, which included 175 local targets and examples of citizen contributions for each SDG. Besides, more than 400 actions arose, though they were not published in the report, as they would serve for establishing the subsequent action plan.

The report incorporated an additional SDG, the 18, dedicated to Culture, following previous experiences such as that of the Estonian government. During the process of aligning and prioritising local targets, the need to treat this issue differently from the rest of the objectives was detected.

THE PARTICIPATORY PROCESS FOR THE ANALYSIS OF THE INITIAL SITUATION AND CHALLENGES - PRIORITIES AND GAPS

As we stated above, a long path has been done by the city council of Manresa to raise awareness and to involve in the sustainability strategy not only municipal staff at political and technical level, but also the local stakeholders and the citizens, both through NGOs and individually. The participation has been understood both as an internal process in the municipality, to engage staff from all departments and council offices, and to open the organisational silos and work in a crosscutting way; and as an external process, to give voice to the citizens and to facilitate the cooperation and sharing initiatives with public and private local stakeholders, as well as multilevel administrations and organisations.

Participation was also conceived as a two-phases process: first, target groups needed to know what we were talking about, so raising awareness campaigns and specific training adapted to each group were developed, before engaging everybody in the debate. Second, proper and adapted participatory sessions, tools, language and messages had to be deployed, depending on the kind of audience and their different availability, capacities, wills and even location. The restrictions of the pandemic also obliged to make some adaptations to the initial plan.

In the following section, we briefly describe the main activities carried out to engage municipal staff, local stakeholders and citizens in the process of localising the SDGs and co-create the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030.

A video was also edited to summarise all the work done until November 2021⁵.

Training courses/workshops for municipal staff

Several training workshops have been organised, aimed at municipal technical and political staff:

- October 2020: Introductory course to SDGs
- November 2020: Co-governance and cross-cutting work, a challenge to achieve the SDGs and new forms of interaction with citizens: From Positive Buildings to La Canal, of the URBACT Network ReGrow-City
- July 2021: Online workshop for the definition and the monitoring of the Manresa 2030 Agenda

Awareness raising actions for the citizens

Since 2019, to raise awareness among the local citizens, the municipality has undertaken wideranging actions and awareness campaigns on the SDGs such as branding the city logo with the SDGs circle, creating the Manresa 2030 Agenda brand and merchandising, opening and regular updating of a specific web section in the municipal portal⁶, dissemination in conventional media and social networks, adds on web, social media and press, large-format advertisements on city buses, a travelling exhibition about SDGs addressed to youth at various facilities in the city, merchandising material with the brand logo, and conferences and workshops aimed at specific groups (schools,



institutes, business associations, other cities, etc.), as well as sessions of social theatre around Responsible Production and Consumption (SDG 12). In 2022, we launched the escape room 'Challenge SDGs Manresa' for schools, tourists and citizens.

Finally, in the end of the year we created the online platform of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030⁷, open to stakeholders and citizens to share local projects, be informed about the whole process and follow the progress made.

Online workshops about SDGs addressed to schools and citizens



Before the restrictions imposed because of the pandemic, workshops were designed for citizens, which had the dual objective of informing about the SDGs and about their achievement in Manresa, on the one hand, and to collect the opinion of the maximum number of local actors for the localization of the SDGs in the city and for the subsequent elaboration of the Manresa 2030 Agenda, on the other. The intention was to give around 100 face-to-face workshops aimed at schools and institutes, neighbourhood associations, socioeconomic agents, social, cultural and environmental

entities, NGOs, religious associations, homes for young people and the elderly, socio-health associations, offices of employment and entrepreneurship, etc., with special emphasis on the most vulnerable groups, with the intention of not leaving anyone behind in this process of information, consultation and call to action.

Unfortunately, the pandemic forced the redesign of the work tool to be able to do it in an online format⁸, and although the workshop was offered to all primary and secondary schools in Manresa and to more than 200 agents in the city, it was only used by educational centres. A total of 14 educational centres and 1.703 students participated in the workshop. 1.688 milestone prioritisation exercises were carried out which gathered 4.276 opinions and contributions to SDGs' localisation in Manresa and the report "*The challenge of the Sustainable Development Goals in Manresa*".

ACTUA: physical workshops of sustainability for citizens

During 2021 and 2022, workshops called ACTUA were organised by the city council, from the cross-cutting work of different municipal departments and in collaboration with local stakeholders.

Manresa City Council, with the support of Barcelona Provincial Council, launched the programme with a double objective: on the one hand, to inform and raise awareness among the population about the global SDGs and local challenges that derive from it; and on the other hand, to involve citizens, individually and collectively, to help make these goals a reality in Manresa.



With this intention, eight very practical and short-term training modules aimed at different audiences were carried out, about: what the SDGs are and how we can contribute to them, how to avoid food waste and cook vegan food, how to use old electrical equipment to make Christmas lights, how to improve school mobility by bike, how to communicate in a non-verbal way violent, how to lose the fear of digital tools on the part of the less experienced population, how to identify butterflies in our environment, or even how to shape and spread the global challenges of sustainability through art.

In the workshops, a short training was first offered and then a collective and voluntary action was proposed, which had a direct impact on the city, such as organizing a collective vegan lunch at the former factory of L'Anònima, hang Christmas lights in the community space of La Canal, set up a bike bus (a bike route to go to school together every Friday), organize a public exhibition on peace, communicating the commitments made by each student, and paint a mural of the SDGs on a street in Manresa.

A video summarized the goals, activities and results achieved with the ACTUA workshops⁹.

Online surveys and in-depth interviews

In order to collect public opinion, between the second half of 2020 and the first quarter of 2021, in a context of restrictions imposed by the pandemic caused by covid-19, a total of 860 surveys were distributed and completed among citizens, via online but also on the streets. To reach a maximum number of people at the street, the city staff went out to different places in the city to survey residents and facilities' users (at the entrance of universities, hospitals, employment offices, supermarkets, the mosque, etc.), and used Catalan, Spanish and Arabic, to cater for the needs of the possible major number of citizens, including the city's large foreign population. It is also important to remark that a simpler, clear and engaging vocabulary was used by the surveyors. For instance, instead of being asked to prioritize the 3 most important SDGs to be tackled in Manresa, they were asked what were for them the three major needs or projects to do in Manresa, both in the short term and in the medium term (2030). Also, a



specific online survey was developed in collaboration with the university, which was available in the app used by the students, and need to be done when opening the app, if they wanted to keep using it.

Also, **85 online surveys** were answered by local entities and organisations and **12 in-depth interviews** with key social agents of the city.

Focus groups with local stakeholders / organisations

In February 2021, with the intention to collect the opinion of key city agents and to validate with them the results obtained in the questionnaire and the interviews carried out, a small group of 17 local expert agents in various fields were selected, who participated in an online session.


A total of 3 sessions were held, one for each major thematic area of the SDGs (People, Planet and Peace and Prosperity), each of which involved local expert agents closely related to the topics addressed. These focus groups were the basis for the identification of local agents interested in joining the ULG.

Main results of the previous participatory process

Surveys, interviews and focus groups:

As a result of both processes, one addressed to citizens and the other to local stakeholders, the following priorities were identified for the city:





Among the activities that citizens indicated to be willing to participate in were: i. Participation: involvement in participative processes, in associations, in neighbourhood meetings, in activities organised by public administrations, etc.; ii. Environment and recycling: respect of natural spaces, caring of urban space, reduction, and separation of waste, etc.; iii. Avoid food waste individually: at home, at office, etc.; iv. Equality and social justice: helping people in need and more discriminated groups to improve society. On the other hand, only 22% wished to be involved in the process and its monitoring, and only 2% wished to receive information about the work on Manresa 2030, highlighting the challenge of making the 2030 Agenda relevant to people.

Most prioritised SDG, by this order are: 1, 4, 11, 13 and 8.



When asked to prioritise local targets, these were the most selected ones:

SDG1: Guarantee that in Manresa there is no person who cannot have a decent roof and an efficient

Provision of basic services (most voted local target by the citizens).

SDG 7/13: Encourage the clean production of electricity through renewable energies (*most voted local target by the local stakeholders*).

SDG 11: Expand and improve the green areas within the urban fabric, enhance all the green areas that surround the city and make the Cardener River more attractive and protected, in order to configure it as a space for recreation and leisure which can be compatible with farming and the protection of biodiversity.

SDG 8: Guarantee access to the labour market for the entire working population, and reduce job insecurity and wage inequalities suffered by certain groups in the city (young people, women, immigrants, and people with disabilities).

SDG 4: Eliminate disparities in regulated education, whether they are inequalities in terms of income, origin, disability, social and cultural environment, educational level of parents, and or discrimination of any other kind, and ensure that the most vulnerable groups have full opportunities to study according to their abilities.





Online workshops to primary and secondary schools:

14 educational centres participated and 1.703 students made contributions, and these are the figures:

- 1.688 prioritisation exercises
- 2.588 new contributions
- 4.276 total contributions to localise the SDGs in Manresa

The SDGs which obtained more contributions from schools were, in this order:

- SDG 5 (Gender equality)
- SDG 1 (End of poverty)
- SDG 2 (Zero hunger)

Inspiring sessions with ULG members (initial)

Building on the participatory process already held by the City Council during 2019 and 2021, and from the SDG local targets already identified in the final report *"The challenge of the Sustainable Development Goals in Manresa"*, the first activities/actions held with the ULG group were the organisation of 3 inspiring sessions in November 2021 devoted to learn from best practices and experiences, to reflect on already identified local targets and actions and to propose new specific actions to be included in the Manresa 2030 Agenda, which were then prioritised, refined and validated in subsequent group sessions and co-creation activities (see sections 1.2.1 and 1.2.2).

SDGs PRIORITIES & GAPS ANALYSIS

In order to make a first diagnosis of the current situation and prioritise goals and targets, the city council started from the analysis of the results obtained in the extensive participatory process, and applied two different methodologies, together with the rest of the cities of the URBACT network: the Reference Framework for Sustainable Cities (RFSC) self-assessment tool¹⁰, and the Photo Essay of the 5 dimensions of the SDGs, the so-called 5 Ps.

Before describing in deeper these two methods and its results, it's worth pointing out two issues.

First, that when trying to compile the contributions from everyone (citizens, stakeholders, officers, politicians) and make them coherent to set the priorities, no matter the methodology used and how carefully can be applied for later analysis, the results of the participation vary depending on the moment (priorities set during the pandemic where not the same as before and after it, the same with the Ukraine war and the prices inflation situation), and also on how the questions are formulated (if they are open, semi-open, or closed). For these reasons, it may seem that some results are contradictory, but this also enriches the analysis.

The second remark is that the localisation of the global goals through the participatory process outlined above focussed on the 2030 Agenda as a whole, and tackled the 17 SDG. In fact, one more was added about culture, the SDG 18, as it's a main policy of the city council.

The municipality sees its role in promoting the holistic framework, yet with some different priority levels. The reason for the comprehensive focus is that the city council has indeed direct or indirect competences in issues related to every goal, even to marine life (though Manresa is located inland),

at to the extent that local activities and Manresa citizens behaviour about the use of plastics, the consumption of fish and the degree of protection of our river water have an impact on this SDG, and others. In sum, local action and policies affect in one way or another the whole range of sustainability goals and that is why all the SDGs should be tackled at different levels and with a holistic vision, although different relevance must be given to each of them, in order to achieve results with limited budget and resources.


THE RFSC SELF-ASSESSMENT RESULTS

In order to identify and visualise the goals and target priorities, the city council used the RFSC selfassessment tool, which facilitates a first mapping of the previous work and relevance given to the SDGs, in order to help afterwards to cross-check the plan or strategy against the goals.

The main criteria used by Manresa to do the mapping, prior to the self-assessment, were basically:

- 1) The relevance of each SDG in the current policies, the Municipal Action Plan and in the Manresa Reconstruction Plan Post-covid
- 2) The prioritisation of goals and targets that the local stakeholders and citizens already did in the frame of the participative process run by the city council in 2019-2021 to localise SDGs and related targets in Manresa
- 3) The ability to influence the goal
- 4) What has already been done at local level

Thus, in the charts from the RFSC self-assessment tool used in the project it is shown that some goals are more prioritised.



There were scored with 4 points most of the citizens' and stakeholders' priorities (in the short term, health - SDG3; economic activity - SDG8, SDG9 and SDG12; education - SDG4; reduction of inequalities - SDG10; and in the mid-long term, urban planning, housing and mobility - SDG11), and





with 3 points two other priorities of local stakeholders in the short term (end of poverty - SDG1; and energy - SDG 7) as well as the three main priorities of the students (gender equality - SDG5, end of poverty - SDG1 and zero hunger - SDG2). The city council also scored the maximum priority to solid, participative and transparent institutions, as it is crucial for the municipality and much work has to be done in it (SDG16).

The less prioritised SDGs are those in which the city has less influence (life below water - SDG 14) or has made more progress until the date, as it is the case of clean and affordable water and sanitation (SDG 6), life on land (SDG 15), and partnerships for the goal (SDG 17).

However, it would not be the case of climate change, which is less prioritised despite the city has some competences on it and it is being dealt with in Manresa only partially, with some measures of adaptation, and very few to mitigate it. As measures to mitigate climate change are tackled mainly in SDG11, basically reducing emissions and mobility, and some other measures to adapt to climate change are already being implemented in SDG 15, through the protection and enhancement of the Green Ring of Manresa, the SDG13 was less prioritised.

THE PHOTO ESSAY OF MANRESA: 5 DIMENSIONS (5 Ps) OF THE 2030 AGENDA

Another way to showcase the initial situation and the priorities of Manresa by 2030 is to link them to the 5 dimensions of the SDGS, so is, the 5 Ps. The 5 Ps of the 2030 Agenda consist of People, Prosperity, Planet, Peace and Partnership. This section presents the strengths, challenges and key data points identified in the analysis of the initial situation and policy targets in the city of Manresa.

The photo essay reflects quite well the priorities of the city highlighted in the results from the RFSC self-assessment, as the same criteria were applied both to the assessment and to the photo essay. However, the photo essay is simpler and briefer than the assessment process, so despite the global coherence, the results are not exactly the same.

This analysis links with the missions and actions of the present IAP, as we'll show it below





People



Strength: The city provides a wide offer of educational, cultural, sport and health activities & facilities, and tries to make them accessible to all citizens.

Challenge: Access to quality housing is a challenge in Manresa, especially in the inner city, where its migrant population is

concentrated. On the other hand, vacant houses in this area are around a quarter of the total houses in the old town, with associated squatter phenomena. Food affordability is neither yet assured in the current context of inflation and precarious labour market.



The IAP tackles the People dimension mainly in the 5th mission, with the aim of reducing inequalities and improving social inclusion, through more and better jobs, affordable housing, the reduction of the digital divide and the fight against any type of discrimination. The 3rd mission is also devoted to this sphere, about accessible green zones in the neighbourhoods, in order to improve health and social relations.

Share of people assisted by the food bank (SDG1 and SDG2), (June 2021): 2.500 users / 78.269 inhabitants = 3,2%

Average life expectancy (SDG3), (year 2019): women (85,6), men (80,4), total (83,1)

Share of population that completed secondary education (SDG4), (1st January 2020): women (33,8%), men (37,5%), total (35,6%)

Share of women among all elected representatives (SDG5), (July 2021): 12 women / 25 elected representatives = 48,0%



Prosperity

Strength: Manresa has modern higher education and research facilities, which include a university campus and the R&D centre Eurecat. There is a powerful industrial activity in Manresa and its surroundings, which makes the area less dependent on services and fluctuant tourism than other Catalan cities to provide jobs.





Challenge: The city wants to recover the historic centre of the city, attracting new activities and population. Almost a quarter of the shops located in the Historic Centre are empty. As an attempt to reverse these figures, a comprehensive revitalisation strategy for the old town began in the 90s, but due to financial constraints and lack of cooperation of property owners, improvements are slightly incremental and react to the availability of external funding sources.

A new challenge for the city, linked to the post-pandemic recovery and the Next Generation EU program, is to transform the local economy aimed at becoming greener and more digitalised, especially the traditional industry of the area, basically related to the car sector.

Prosperity dimension is reflected in the IAP mainly through the 6th mission, to have a competitive and sustainable local economy, thanks to technological innovation, the use of clean energies,



circular production systems, sustainable tourism and a better articulation of the territory, as well as the 2nd mission, to invest in the preservation of its historical, cultural and architectural heritage, and the 5th mission, about social inclusion.

Planet



Strength: The awesome Green Ring of Manresa, increasingly popular for leisure, tourism and sport, combined with farming activity and biodiversity protection is a major asset of the che city.

Challenge: One challenge is to reduce the use of private cars and to increase walking and

cycling, through overcoming structural weaknesses (few and disconnected cycle paths, a hilly city). The other target is to increase the recycling rate and circular economy initiatives, and to decrease the total amount of urban and industrial waste.



1st and 4th missions of the IAP are mainly devoted to the Planet: the first mission is to have a more sustainable mobility, which will connect the city and its surroundings, prioritizing public transport, pedestrian zones and bike lanes; and the basic equipment and services will be at a maximum of 15 minutes from all points of the city. And the fourth mission is to enjoy a Green Ring in Manresa with a preserved environment, rich in healthy, sports, educational and touristic spaces, where biodiversity will be protected and local agriculture and sustainable food will be promoted

Strength: Manresa has a public facility devoted to the promotion of global solidarity and peace: the House of Peace and Solidarity (called Flors Sirera House).



Challenge: A main mission of the city is to achieve social cohesion in an increasingly multicultural city, with a special focus on the inclusion of foreign unaccompanied minors.

Another target is to be more transparent and accountable as a city council, and promote the participation of citizens in public life.







The IAP gives answer to this dimension with the 7th mission, by which all municipal policies will incorporate transparency, citizen participation, the gender perspective and the evaluation of results.

Data point

Participation rate in latest local elections (SDG16), (May 2019): 61,6% (voters over list of voters)

Partnership



Strength: For achieving SDGs, Manresa promotes alliances at national and international level (provincial government of Barcelona, Eurotowns and URBACT).

Challenge: The city council would like to improve co-governance through the involvement of stakeholders and citizens not only when designing plans, but also in the



implementation and evaluation of the actions.

The 8th mission of the IAP states that the city council will establish solid multistakeholder and multi-level alliances to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals, giving special support to organisations and citizen initiatives.

Data point

Number of municipal platforms of cooperation with stakeholders, created by the city council (SDG17), (June 2021): one Citizens' Council, ten Sectoral Councils for specific topics, and four Territorial Councils, one for each district of the city. One neighbours' platform in the Historic Centre, called La Canal, was created through URBACT Re-grow City network.

1.2. Focus of the Integrated Action Plan

1.2.1. The Integrated Action Plan: a participatory co-creation process

ULG COMPOSITION AND SET-UP PROCESS

Possibly the most important part of the project was the establishment of the URBACT Local Group (ULG), to establish a team who have both local knowledge of the city and of the activities developed, and opportunities and challenges faced, but also find people who are trusted by the community and are active within it. It was important to be inclusive, to ensure the global goals were put in practice through the process of setting-up the ULG and that all people and citizens were represented. It became clear that some of the people nominated were active in a number of areas related to the 17+1 SDGs and the five dimensions, which provided the benefit of a greater outreach.





In February 2021, the city organised three differentiated sessions, three focus groups (Planet, People and Prosperity-Peace) with local stakeholders and experts in each area, which provided the basis for the creation of the URBACT Local Group (ULG). The ULG, composed amongst others, of members (local stakeholders) from the three focus groups organised in early 2021, around People, Planet and Prosperity-Peace, as well as members of the Board for the Social and Economic Reconstruction Plan, was set up in October 2021.

ULG was sought to include people from different age groups. Therefore, the composition of the group was diverse in ages and in representation of this in diverse entities. Youngsters were also an important age group to include. To ensure the active participation of young people, all schools in the city were invited to participate in the ULG, and finally the ULG counted with several students and teachers from a local secondary school called FEDAC, which is developing education projects to engage its community in the SDGs and sustainability action. The secondary education centre that participated provided young people's voice and future generations.

Among the ULG members there are also key entities from Manresa in the field of health, with Althaia as representative. Due to the uniqueness of the Green Ring and the agricultural tradition of Manresa, it was seen as critical that organisations such as the Bages Consortium for waste management, Meandre - association for the preservation of the natural heritage Manresa and Pla de Bages, and the Parc de la Sèquia were actively involved in the group. Also, it was fundamental that universities (FUB and UPC) and R+D centres such as EURECAT, trade unions and trade associations were present in the Prosperity Area, among others.

The ULG members are small in number but large in the scale and diversity of their involvement and volunteerism in the local community. The ULG members cover major cross-cutting pillars across the city: Municipal, Political, Educational, Community Groups and Private. **The members who are part of the ULG are:**

THE PARTICIPATORY AND CO-CREATION PROCESS WITH THE ULG







Presentation and constitution session

On the 7th of October 2021, the ULG was formally established with a presentation ceremony at El Centre de l'Aigua. The city council team and the ULG coordinators presented the aims of the group, the methodology and process for the different phases of the development of the Manresa 2030 Agenda.

The members of the group introduced themselves and shared the expectations of the participation of each entity as members of the local group in the process of creating the Manresa 2030 Agenda.

Two group dynamics were developed. First, they were asked to prioritise the 3 most priority SDGs in each area: people, planet and prosperity through responding to a Menti.

Secondly, a group dynamic in which participants worked in subgroups related to specific areas: people, planet and prosperity to get to know each other more in-depth. They were asked to share with others: where we come from, professional profile or trajectory, star project that their organisation or entity was already carrying out in line with the Manresa 2030 Agenda.





Inspiring visits

Three inspiring visits to key experiences and projects that were representative of Manresa's challenges in the area of People, Plant and Prosperity were organised during November 2021. The methodology followed during the sessions had three phases:

- Visit to an innovative and inspiring space, project and/or experience.
- Individual and group dynamics to promote reflection, team work, proposal of new actions and group sharing. The ULG participants proposed new actions to define the Manresa 2030 Agenda to be included in the document developed by citizen technicians in a first phase of participation.
- Feedback of the session to all ULG members, to give them the opportunity to participate and enrich the proposed actions. Sharing the actions proposed for each SDG through email and an open questionnaire where all members could include additional actions per SDG.

The visits organised included:

- People: the neighbourhood plan project of Barcelona City was visited, to inspire key actions that could be replicated in the old neighbourhood of Manresa.
- Prosperity: the social enterprise Moltacte was visited, an example of the integration of the economic and social vision, through the employment of people with disabilities.
- Planet: Bufalvent Environmental Park was visited, in order to make the ULG aware of the impact of the

city's waste in the short and medium term and to see how waste is managed and recycled.

Feedback and prioritisation session



A feedback and action prioritisation session was organised in December 2021 with the ULG Members. The entire ULG was convened to work on the overall actions of the Manresa 2030 Agenda that had been collected during the whole participatory process and the inspiring visits. Members were asked to prioritise the 30 most transformative actions to be included in the Agenda.











The process followed included:

- About 100 pre-selected actions were shown to participants, from the more than 600 detected in previous participatory processes and ULG sessions. They were pre-selected based on most prioritised local targets from each SDG
- The actions were distributed in three blocks: People, Planet and Prosperity
- Participants were allowed to add new actions to the blocks, and they added:
 - o 35 new actions for People
 - o 35 new actions for Planet
 - o 22 new actions for Prosperity
- They were asked to choose the 30 actions they considered most relevant (they were recommended to choose 10 actions from each area)







Co-creation of the IAP vision, missions and actions, and validation session

Based on the 30 most transformative actions selected from prioritised local targets and more than 600 actions arose by the whole participatory process, the ULG co-created the vision of the future city. It was in this temporal sequence and not the other way around, as Manresa had already worked for a long time in the prioritisation of SDGs, local targets and actions once the URBACT network suggested its city members to establish a shared vision and several missions, in an innovative intervention logic.

Thus, through face-to-face sessions and individual online participation, a shared city and 8 missions of the IAP were extracted. method technique was used (see section

At a ULG session held in April 2022, the city the 8 missions and the 30 transformative actions for the Manresa of the 2030 were shared and finally validated with ULG members (see section 1.2.1). These were developed through an internal analysis of actions identified through previous participatory processes and sessions, the

of the Q method and the prioritisation of city council officers.

The ULG validated the final 30 actions and proposals of sub-actions were made from the entities themselves that complemented the proposals made by the City Council, having the opportunity to provide ideas of how to make the action become a reality. The next steps and the role that the ULG should play in the implementation of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030 were also discussed and agreed upon.

Thus, the ULG has been active in the process of creating the Agenda, but will also be active in its implementation and monitoring. There is will and motivation for the group to remain active and ensure



the proper development of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030.

Validation by the city council:

After the ULG validation, the vision, missions and 30 actions contained in the IAP were validated by the municipal government in two sessions held in September and October 2022. Slight changes were made by them, and afterwards by the rest of the political groups of the city council, in a session held in November 2022, before its approval by consensus of the plenary session of the city council, in an attempt to ensure that the city strategic plan will remain as the main roadmap to 2030, despite any political change.

1.2.2. The SDG Story and Missions

When thinking about the future vision of Manresa, a main question arose: do all municipal staff, stakeholders and citizens, really share a common positive vision of the future of our city? Or are there several visions of the future city, shared by different groups of local stakeholders, that can be all valid, meaningful and sustainable? And which vision (or visions) are these?

To answer all these questions, and to elucidate which could be the shared vision(s), the city council decided to use the Q-Method¹¹, a methodology based on the ordering of statements and factor analysis to search for correlations between the positions adopted by a series of people in relation to a series of statements, and to reveal and describe convergent/divergent views in a group as well as consensus. Q-method looks for correlations between subjects across a sample of variables. Q-factor analysis reduces subjects' diverse individual viewpoints to several "factors", which represent shared ways of thinking.

As we mentioned in 1.2.1 section, during the participatory and co-creation process developed with the ULG group, an exercise of prioritisation of actions was organised, in which key local stakeholders had to select individually the 30 actions most relevant to the city according to their viewpoint to reach SDGs local targets of the city in 2030.

They were shown about 100 pre-selected actions, of the more than 600 detected in previous participatory processes and in ULG sessions, from all the proposals received until the moment either from municipal staff, local stakeholders, citizens, and ULG members, through the participatory




process that the city council is carrying out since 2019. The pre-selection, as we said, was done based on the most prioritised local targets.

With the information collected, an internal analysis of the most voted actions was conducted and 30 actions were selected considering: actions most voted by the group; municipal star projects that should be included; ensure that all the SDGs were covered; and ensure the 3 Ps (Planet, Prosperity and People) were balanced. Also, crosscutting actions were included (partnerships and participation), forming a total of 32 pre-selected actions.

These 32 pre-selected actions were the statements of the questionnaire used in the Q methodology exercise to define the vision of the future city. 35 members of the ULG participated in the vision exercise, completing the questionnaire individually through a computer application.

The exercise consisted in using a sample with 32 boxes and asking ULG members, individually, to place each of the 32 actions in one of the boxes, based on the degree of priority that they think it has, from most priority action to less priority one. We also asked them to justify why they chose the most and the least priority action (only these two).



From the quantitative and qualitative analysis of the answers, four very marked common factors (or action selection patterns) were observed, which referred to 4 visions of the city. As they were complementary and not really opposite to each other, they were joined in one single shared vision, which in turn was broken down into 8 missions to achieve it. Also, the 30 transformative actions were then reviewed, refined and shared with city council officers in order to include also their views.

These were then shared and agreed with the ULG members in a validation session of the city vision, where the 8 missions and the 30 transformative actions were presented, including a video¹² outlining the process and the Manresa 2030 city vision.

THE FOUR VISIONS:

Through the Q-method, we discovered four main visions, not opposed between them but with different viewpoints about which are the priorities to achieve the best future for Manresa. To sum them up in a few words:

Vision 1: Nature preservation and Proximity

The first vision highlights the preservation of nature and the proximity of the amenities of the future city.

Vision 2: Social inclusion and Equality

In the second vision, social inclusion and equality are the most important goals to achieve in 2030.

Vision 3: Heritage and Local identity

In vision three, the future Manresa has, above all, a protected local heritage and a strong local identity.

Vision 4: Economic modernisation and territorial perspective

In the last vision, Manresa will transform its economy and be more open and coordinated with the surrounding municipalities.

A COMMON VISION:

In an attempt to combine the four visions, one single future vision for Manresa by 2030 was agreed, which is a city that ensures social inclusion and equality, while achieving a sustainable economic modernisation with a territorial perspective. It will be a 15-minute city that preserves the urban and peri-urban nature, as well as its local heritage and its strong local identity.

THE 8 MISSIONS OF THE URBAN AGENDA OF MANRESA 2030:

As a result of this future vision process, eight missions by the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030 were defined:

- 1. By 2030, Manresa will have a more sustainable mobility, which will connect the city and its surroundings, prioritising public transport, pedestrian zones and bike lanes. The basic equipment and services will be at a maximum of 15 minutes from all points of the city.
- 2. By 2030, Manresa will invest in the preservation of its historical, cultural and architectural heritage.
- 3. By 2030, Manresa will offer accessible green areas in its neighbourhoods, key to improving health and social relations.
- 4. By 2030, we will enjoy a Green Ring around Manresa with a preserved environment, rich in healthy, sports, educational and touristic spaces, where biodiversity will be protected and local agriculture and sustainable food will be promoted.
- 5. By 2030, we will have succeeded in reducing inequalities and improving social inclusion, through more and better jobs, affordable housing, the reduction of the digital gap and the fight against any type of discrimination.
- 6. By 2030, we will have a competitive and sustainable local economy, thanks to technological innovation, the use of clean energies, circular production systems and a better articulation of the territory.
- 7. By 2030, all municipal policies will incorporate transparency, citizen participation, the gender perspective and the evaluation of results.
- 8. By 2030, the City Council will establish solid multi-stakeholder and multi-level alliances to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals, giving special support to organisations and citizen initiatives.





Part 2 - The Integrated Action Plan and its implementation

2. The Integrated Action Plan

From the previous participatory process, as well as the work done by the ULG, there were finally defined and agreed:

- one vision of future
- 8 missions
- 175 local targets
- 30 integrated actions

2.1 Summary of Missions, Actions, SDGs and Objectives of the Spanish Urban Agenda

As we stated before, our main goal is to align our IAP with the 2030 Agenda SDGs as well as the Objectives of the Spanish Urban Agenda. Thus, we present below the 8 missions and the 30 Actions under the umbrella of both Agendas.

To do so, the 17 + 1 SDGs have been already introduced in previous chapters. The 10 Objectives of the Spanish Urban Agenda are the following:

WHAT WILL BE DONE?

An overview of the key actions of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030 per Mission is presented in this section, including the whole titles and a short description of each action. The detailed Action Tables can be found in the Appendix 1.

MISSION 1: Sustainable mobility and 15-minute city

HOW WILL WE MEASURE SUCCESS?

The indicators that are determined for each of the 30 actions of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030 have been drawn up taking into consideration a couple of premises. First of all, we wanted to work with already existing indicators, common indicators used by other cities. In this way, it will be possible to compare Manresa's indicators with other similar cities. Secondly, we have avoided considering an extensive and complex battery of indicators that, to be updated, would require a great dedication in terms of working hours.

For these reasons, we have chosen the battery of indicators of the Visor 2030 platform developed by the Diputació of Barcelona; this platform measures the degree of achievement of the Sustainable Development Objectives of each municipality in the province. Visor 2030 includes 55 indicators, seven of which are not relevant for Manresa as they refer to beaches or areas of the Natural Parks Network of Barcelona Province.





The 48 indicators which are valid for Manresa for measuring the degree of achievement of the SDGs are used for measuring the impact of the 30 actions of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030. These indicators are easy to get, have a long historical series of data, are permanently updated and allow comparison with other medium-sized cities in the province of Barcelona.

Based on the last value recorded for each indicator, a panel of experts has determined the target value that the indicator should reach in the 2030 horizon.

3. Setting the IAP up for implementation

3.1. Local Governance of the Action Plan / SDG localisation (Framework for delivery)

Following the philosophy and principles of the UN 2030 Agenda and URBACT recommendations, the proposed governance model for implementing and monitoring the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030 will be based on internal cross-cutting and integrated work as well as external participatory bodies.

As for the internal organisation, an **Executive Board**, already created to localise the SDGs and elaborate the IAP, will boost the whole process. It is composed of two officers and one advisor from Presidency and Mayor's Staff Service, and supported by the Presidency Councillor. They will keep working on a daily base, organising meetings at different levels, facilitating and supervising the implementation of actions, and being the main responsible for updating indicators and reporting progress.

To do so, they will count on the **different departments of the municipality**: the executive board will organise regular meetings to explain and coordinate actions with specific officers from each area, previously selected, as well as asking for data to update the indicators. This interaction will be ensured through joint meetings and also by bilateral contacts.

Finally, reporting and amending will be done each semester in the frame of the **government team**, in a special session devoted to review the IAP progress and make decisions on the transformation of the city.

Related to the external participation, as we mentioned in section 1.2.1. (The Integrated Action Plan: a participatory co-creation process), during the process of localising the Agenda a participatory organism was created, called URBACT Local Group, formed by around 50 stakeholders representing a wide range of local public and private entities and NGOs from all fields: economic, environmental, social and cultural. This will be the main citizens' body for providing information, giving different views, making contributions and reviewing the progress made. We will also open the doors to the participation of experts, as well as non-organised citizens that wish to contribute and be engaged in the process. We'll call this forum the **Citizen Alliance for Sustainability**.

The Alliance will meet at least once a year, and their members will be able to build **ad hoc reduced working groups** for specific projects, and to interact also through a digital platform, where the IAP will be shown, the actions reported and measured, and the Alliance presented.

Thus, in order to support the governance of the IAP and keep record of the process and implementation, the city council has created a **digital platform of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030**, which is accessible to everybody at a first level, and only to engaged stakeholders at a second level, with the aim at sharing local projects, being informed about the members of the future ULG and about the whole process, and following the progress made.

Both in the physical meetings and in the online platform, members of the Alliance will share projects and actions that they are developing related to the Agenda. All citizens will also be able to enter the platform and be informed of the activity, projects, meetings and conclusions.

The Alliance members will be the **Ambassadors of the Agenda**, supporting raising awareness campaigns on SDGs and taking their own actions.

Finally, we must say that we will continue our mission of actively involving **secondary and primary schools and universities** of Manresa in activities addressed specifically to the students, both aiming at raising awareness on sustainability among them, and engaging them in concrete actions to reach the local targets of the SDGs.





3.2. Resources and funding

All the actions described in the Integrated Action Plan need both staff and financial resources.

Actions led by the city council will count on regular staff of departments in charge of them, besides ad hoc experts and local stakeholders involved in each case, as stated in the tables.

As for the funding, some actions depend on the regular annual budget from the municipality, while others rely on external funding, partially or totally.

Thus, the funding strategy is based in two pillars:

- Aligning the IAP with the municipal budget approved annually
- Searching external funding, through:
 - Agreements and application to calls from upper administrations
 - Agreements with local stakeholders, in public-private partnerships

Related to external calls, the city council is focused mainly in the current Next Generation UE programme derived from the Spanish government Plan of Recovery, Transformation and Resilience (2020-2026), with several components and funding lines to finance projects and actions that need to be implemented at local level. Several calls have been already launched, and others are expected.

The Spanish Plan is aligned with the European Union goals to promote a greener economic development, a more just society with reduced gender gap, and a digitalisation and modernisation of the Administration, in line with the SDGs of the UN. As the IAP is in line with the Spanish Plan, funding for several actions and sub-actions of the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030 have been already approved or are pendant to, such as:

- Acquisition of electric urban buses (Action 2)
- Sustainable recovery of the Torre Lluvià equipment in the Green Ring (Action 4)
- Sustainable tourism project: caravanning and accessibility to tourist assets (Action 4)
- Improvement of accessibility and sustainability of tourist equipments (Action 4 and Action 6)
- Sustainable renewal of the future Museum of Baroque of Catalonia (Action 5)
- Re-naturalization of the river area (Action 9)
- Sustainable recovery of old L'Anònima factory (Action 10)
- Sustainable recovery of social and affordable housing (Action 14)
- Sustainable recovery of old Fàbrica Nova factory (Action 23)
- Digitalisation of the local Administration (Action 27)

Related to the Agreements with local stakeholders, in public-private partnerships, these agreements will be promoted and conducted basically through the Citizen Alliance for Sustainability and its working groups, as well as in bilateral meetings between the city council and local companies and organisations to boost specific projects.





3.3. Concluding remarks

The Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030 is composed of one vision of the future, 8 missions, 175 local sustainability targets and 30 transformative integrated actions to be implemented by 2030. The City of Manresa has set up jointly with multiple-stakeholders this ambitious sustainability agenda to be achieved by 2030. In the journey of developing and assessing progress made of the actions included in the agenda, the involvement of the city council, local and regional stakeholders, associations, companies, administrations and governments will be key for its success.

In this sense, to prevent possible risks for not achieving this strategic plan, mainly the potential lack of technical and financial resources and the lack of political support, which are the greatest risks that have been identified through the process of defining the Agenda, the Integrated Action Plan includes several actions that are oriented to overcome them.

Key actions envisioned to overcome possible challenges and barriers are the establishment and consolidation of multi-level and multi-stakeholder alliances for the achievement of the SDGs and the Urban Agenda of Manresa 2030, with special support for citizen organisations and initiatives.

The implementation of monitoring and accountability processes led by citizens and local organisations will be possible mainly through the creation and empowerment of the City Alliance for Sustainability to promote and monitor the progress of the Agenda, and the creation of an interactive virtual space to enable interaction between local stakeholders and citizens and to visualise the progress towards achieving the SDGs in Manresa. These physical and virtual spaces will put pressure on local policy makers and the city council to achieve the goals, , as well as it will give strengtheness to the whole process in order to find the necessary funding.

It is also key to strengthen technical and financial collaboration of the Manresa City Council with the higher territorial administrations for the implementation and monitoring of the city's comprehensive sustainability strategy. It will be possible through the participation of the city council in transnational projects that allow improving the city's capacity to solve shared challenges with the global community, the active search for regional and European funding, and the consolidation of international relations and local diplomacy through networks of cities and international bodies.


